The Heidelberg Catechism #103

The Fourth Commandment

Exodus 20:8-11

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. 

MISSIONS INFORMATION

Mission Highlight-Rafiki Foundation

The mission of The Rafiki Foundation is to help Africans know God and raise their standard of living with excellence and integrity. Rafiki's home office is in Eustis, Florida. Rafiki has training villages in the African countries of Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Liberia, Malawi, Nigeria, Rwanda, Tanzania, Uganda, and Zambia. These villages are operated by long-term missionaries who are assisted by national workers and short-term missionaries.

Saint Andrew's has supported Rafiki since 2006 through child sponsorship and financial support. Rafiki uses those funds to support missionaries in each training village and the local staff in Florida. These men and women love and serve their neighbors through Rafiki's five programs: Childcare, Education, the Rafiki Advanced Learning Institute (RALI), Widows, and Bible Study. The Childcare Program provides a loving home to about 100 orphans in each Rafiki Village. The Education Program includes pre-K through twelfth grade schools at each village for the residents and impoverished children from the surrounding communities. All are instructed with the Rafiki School Curriculum which integrates a biblical worldview into a traditional liberal arts core of arts, letters, sciences, and mathematics. The RALI program is training African young adults to be Christian classical educators. Rafiki's goal is to train teachers and provide our curriculum for our African church partners' schools, thereby reaching thousands of children with the gospel, sound doctrine, and topquality education. The Widows Program gives African widows and impoverished women of the church a means of employment and artistic expression through the making of handcrafts. All programs incorporate the Rafiki Bible Study, an in-depth study of all 66 books of the Bible, written by noted theologians for Rafiki and the people
