Missions Highlight – John Barros – Street Evangelist in Orlando, FL

John works with Presbyterian Evangelistic Fellowship ministering to men, women, and unborn children through sidewalk counseling, preaching, and evangelism at the largest abortion clinic in Orlando. He estimates that 100-125 babies are murdered at this location every week. Through John's daily ministry in front of the abortion clinic, he has witnessed numerous lives changed and babies saved by the restorative power of the gospel. John also serves as a volunteer chaplain at Orlando's 33rd Street Jail with Good News Jail and Prison Ministries.

John and his wife Vicki along with their 3 children Jeremy, Jesse, and Rachel joined the Presbyterian Evangelistic Fellowship (PEF) in 2011. Presbyterian Evangelistic Fellowship is a nonprofit faith mission whose purpose is to practice, train and equip God's people to do biblical evangelism, anywhere, anytime, with anyone.

Please pray for John as he preaches the gospel and ministers to people in an area of great spiritual darkness here in Central Florida. May God grant repentance to those who listen to his message, for the lives of many unborn children to be saved, and for men and women to find forgiveness and healing in Jesus Christ.
