The Westminster Shorter Catechism #63-66

The Fifth Commandment

Exodus 20:12

Minister: What is the fifth commandment?

People: The fifth commandment is, "Honor your father and your mother that your days may be long upon the land which the LORD your God is giving you."

Minister: What is required in the fifth commandment?

People: The fifth commandment requires the preserving the honor, and performing the duties, belonging to everyone in their several places and relations, as superiors, inferiors, or equals.

Minister: What is forbidden in the fifth commandment?

People: The fifth commandment forbids the neglecting of, or doing anything against, the honor and duty which belongs to everyone in their several places and relations.

Minister: What is the reason added to the fifth commandment?

People: The reason added to the fifth commandment is, a promise of long life and prosperity (as far as it shall serve for God's glory and their own good) to all such as keep this commandment.
