READING OF THE LAW The Westminster Shorter Catechism #45-48

The First Commandment Exodus 20:3

Minister: What is the first commandment?
People: The first commandment is, "You shall have no other gods before Me."

Minister: What is required in the first commandment?
People: The first commandment requires us to know and acknowledge God to be the only true God, and our God, and to worship and glorify Him accordingly.

Minister: What is forbidden in the first commandment?
People: The first commandment forbids the denying, or not worshipping and glorifying, the true God as God, and our God; and the giving of that worship and glory to any other, which is due to Him alone.

Minister: What are we specially taught by these words "before Me" in the first commandment?
People: These words "before Me" in the first commandment teach us that God, who sees all things, takes notice of, and is much displeased with, the sin of having any other god.

We are scheduled to celebrate the Lord's Supper next Lord's Day during the morning worship services. Let us therefore follow Paul's admonition in 1 Corinthians 11:27-29 to partake of the Lord's Supper in a worthy manner by examining ourselves before the Lord. The Westminster Shorter Catechism states, "It is required of them that would worthily partake of the Lord's Supper, that they examine themselves of their knowledge to discern the Lord's body, of their faith to feed upon Him, of their repentance, love, and new obedience; lest, coming unworthily, they eat and drink judgment to themselves" (Answer 97).
