AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Heidelberg Catechism #9-11

Minister: *But doesn't God do us an injustice by requiring in His law what we are unable to do?*

People: No, God created humans with the ability to keep the law. They, however, tempted by the devil, in reckless disobedience, robbed themselves and all their descendants of these gifts.

Minister: *Will God permit such disobedience and rebellion to go unpunished?*

People: Certainly not. He is terribly angry about the sin we are born with as well as the sins we personally commit. As a just judge He punishes them now and in eternity. He has declared: "Cursed is everyone who does not continue to do everything written in the Book of the Law."

Minister: *But isn't God also merciful?*

People: God is certainly merciful, but He is also just. His justice demands that sin, committed against His supreme majesty, be punished with the supreme penalty—eternal punishment of body and soul.
