READING OF THE LAW The Westminster Shorter Catechism #53–56
The Third Commandment Exodus 20:7

Minister: *Which is the third commandment?*
People: The third commandment is, “You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain; for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes His name in vain.”

Minister: *What is required in the third commandment?*
People: The third commandment requires the holy and reverent use of God’s names, titles, attributes, ordinances, Word, and works.

Minister: *What is forbidden in the third commandment?*
People: The third commandment forbids all profaning and abusing of anything whereby God makes Himself known.

Minister: *What is the reason added to the third commandment?*
People: The reason added to the third commandment is, that however the breakers of this commandment may escape punishment from men, yet the LORD our God will not allow them to escape His righteous judgment.
