And when, as Judge, Thou drawest nigh The secrets of our hearts to try, To recompense each hidden sin And bid the saints their reign begin.


O let us not, weak, sinful men, Be driven from Thy presence then, But with Thy saints forever stand In perfect love at Thy right hand.
