POSITION SUMMARY

The Chief Musician will provide leadership and musical expertise to direct, structure, coordinate, and implement a full-orbed musical dimension to the ministry life of Saint Andrew's in a manner that supports the church's overall vision and mission. Applicants must have a minimum Master of Music in church music, music education, or related degree, however, a Doctor of Musical Arts is preferred. We seek someone with at least three years of experience as a church music professional. Any candidate must be a professing Christian who is a member in good standing of a church in the Presbyterian or Reformed traditions who is in agreement with the doctrine, worship, and historical, traditional music emphasis of Saint Andrew's Chapel. This is a full-time, salaried position with benefits.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Lord's Day Worship

- Plan and coordinate carefully designed choral and congregational music for all Lord's Day worship services
- Select musical scores for choral and congregational singing
- Work with administrative staff to plan and format the music and liturgy for Lord's Day bulletins
- Work with the pastors to regularly review the involvement of choirs and musicians who serve in worship services

Church Choirs and Orchestra

- Lead and shepherd the chancel and chamber choirs, supervise the handbell choir and its director, the youth choir and its director, and the children's choir and its director
- Manage and oversee the recruiting of those with musical gifts to serve the church through choirs, vocal ensembles, solo vocalists or instrumentalists
- Direct the choir during worship services
- Teach, instruct, and conduct all musicians in rehearsals and services
- Instruct the choirs how and why Saint Andrew's seeks to worship God, particularly as it relates to corporate worship
- Manage and conduct a 10-piece professional chamber orchestra (6 strings, horn, oboe, flute, percussion). Demonstrate expertise in Finale or Sibelius (preparing orchestral scores/parts), in orchestral library indexing and management, conducting technique, score preparation, and rehearsal management
- Supervise instrumentalists, vocal soloists, and accompanists
- Audition and contract with accompanists and other instrumentalists when needed
- Provide musical advice and assistance to others within the church requiring musical support, for example: Men's and Women's conferences, outreach events, and missions festivals

Church Music Staff

- Supervise the organist, children's choir directors, including music and conservatory administrative staff
- Develop, submit, and manage an annual budget for the music ministry
- Participate in regular meetings with church staff
- Maintain professional skills through practice and participation in worship and other continuing
